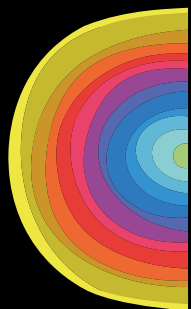
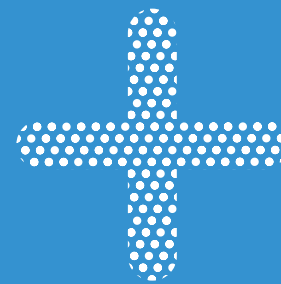

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PASTORAL STRUCTURE



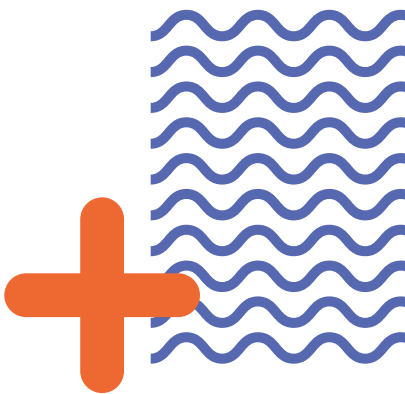
At Mortimer Community College, we pride ourselves on our pastoral care. A student's happiness and wellbeing are recognised as the foundation for their success. Effective pastoral care underpins school life and there is always someone to whom the students can turn to for help, support and advice.

Our pastoral care system has a horizontal structure, based on year groups, which sees a Key Stage Coordinator and Head of Year working closely with their form tutor team to ensure that we get to know every student. Students are individually valued and supported. Students see their form tutors every day; form tutors have immediate access to information about students' achievements, and any incidents during the day, through ClassCharts.

The Head of Year and Assistant Head of Year should be the first point of contact for parents who have queries or concerns about academic progress or effort.

Our pastoral care system aims to promote responsible behaviour and respect for ourselves and each other. We are committed to a positive approach and, whenever possible, praise and rewards are used to motivate and encourage our students.

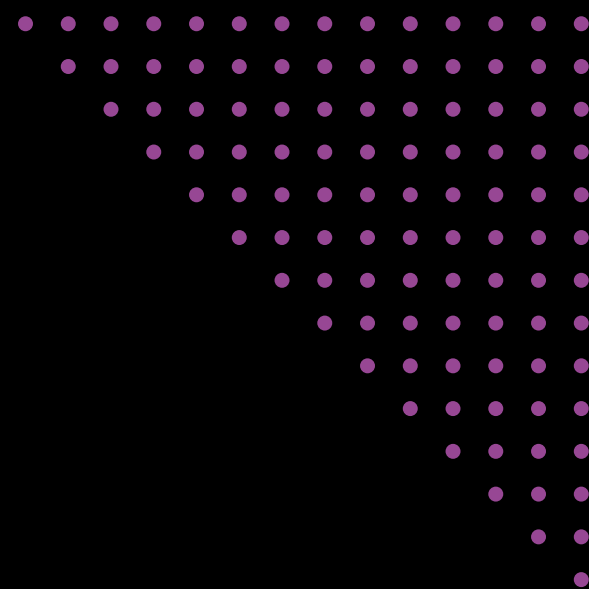
There is a set of expectations which students are expected to follow at all times; this is underpinned by appropriate rewards and sanctions, as set out in the school's behaviour policy.

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SCHOOL DAY

Students must be in school by 8:45am in their designated area, with students going straight into lesson one at 8:50am. The day consists of five one hour lessons with a twenty minute break and a twenty minute form time in the morning. There is a thirty minute lunch break during one of our three servings. The school day finishes at 3:00pm.

We expect all students to have a **bag suitable for carrying school books and equipment**. As a minimum, students are expected to have a black/blue **AND** red pen, pencil, ruler and pencil case - it is advisable to have spare equipment.

Stationery can be purchased before lesson one, and during breaktime and lunchtime, at the equipment store behind the school theatre.

It is also advisable for students to bring in their own Casio scientific calculator (fx-83GTX), or the slightly newer model (fx-85GTX).

UNIFORM

All students are required to wear:

Upper body:

- white shirt (long or short sleeved);
- school tie (bought from Initial Images);
- official black school jumper or cardigan fastened with school logo (bought from Initial Images), or
- official black abaya or black thobe (bought from Maha).

Lower body:

- black school trousers or tailored plain black shorts (not tight fitting/cargo/sports);
- no stretchy fabric pants, jeans, tracksuit pants, leggings or jeggings;
- black skirt - pleated Charleston or A line style only (must be an appropriate length, just above the knee);
- no pencil skirts or tube skirts;
- black tights or black or white socks;
- formal smart black school shoes (no trainers, plimsolls or canvas shoes e.g. Converse & Vans).

Please note: no jewellery or facial piercings are to be worn, with the exception of a watch. Hair colouring must be discrete and natural. Students are allowed to wear a suitable plain coat of their choice, but it must be taken off in the school building at all times. School jumpers must remain on at all times and must not be tied in any way. Students are permitted to ask to remove jumpers in lessons.



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PE UNIFORM



All students are required to wear:

Upper body PE kit:

- black PE T-shirt with school logo (bought from Initial Images), or
- black PE long sleeved T-shirt with school logo (bought from Initial Images);
- optional plain black base underlayer with no visible branding;
- optional black pull-over ¼ zip long sleeved training top with school logo (bought from Initial Images) - please note this is the only outdoor wear allowed for PE lessons.

Lower body PE kit:


- black sports leggings - as plain as possible with no large motifs (available with school logo from Initial Images);
- black tracksuit pants - as plain as possible with no large motifs (available with school logo from Initial Images);
- black shorts* (available with school logo from Initial Images);
- black skort (skirt with shorts underneath);
- trainers (no plimsolls or canvas shoes e.g. Converse & Vans).

Please note: tracksuit pants and leggings with the school logo on are currently optional and can be purchased from our uniform supplier, Initial Images. However, as stated, they must be black if you purchase non-school PE tracksuit pants or leggings.

*If your child decides to wear shorts for PE, they MUST be the black shorts with the school logo from Initial Images. Any other style of shorts are not acceptable - including cycling shorts.



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SOUTH SHIELDS F.C. ACADEMY



Launched in 2017, South Shields F.C. Academy set out to create the best possible platform for promising, young and local players to realise their potential and progress within the game. The Futures Academy is one strand of the ever-growing South Shields F.C. Academy; it exists as an in-school football programme covering the U12 to U16 age groups.

Futures Academy students at Mortimer receive a minimum of 6-8 hours of professional coaching every week throughout the full academic year (September - July). A comprehensive games programme is arranged to further add to the learning experience. The programme is delivered by a team of full-time coaches, supported by additional part-time staff. The programme is designed to complement the ongoing development at grassroots and professional clubs. Our current cohort represent a wide range of clubs across the North East on a weekend and this is something we encourage and celebrate.

The purpose of the Futures Academy programme is to:

- prepare young people for sport;
- prepare young people through sport.

In a survey conducted with existing Futures Academy players and parents/carers, we found that:

- students report high enjoyment and satisfaction on a daily basis;
- the football-in-education programme has helped students feel good about themselves and more confident as footballers and young people;
- students feel they are improving quickly and are more skilled players thanks to their involvement in the Futures Academy;
- as outlined above, students and parents/carers reported a more positive perception towards education as a result of being part of the academy;
- students have made new friendships and feel valued within school.

ADMISSIONS

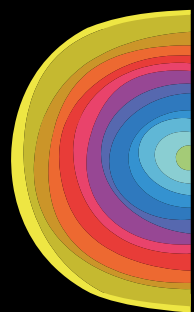

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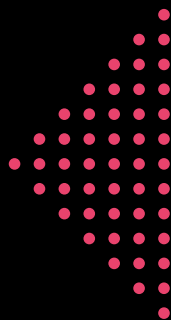
