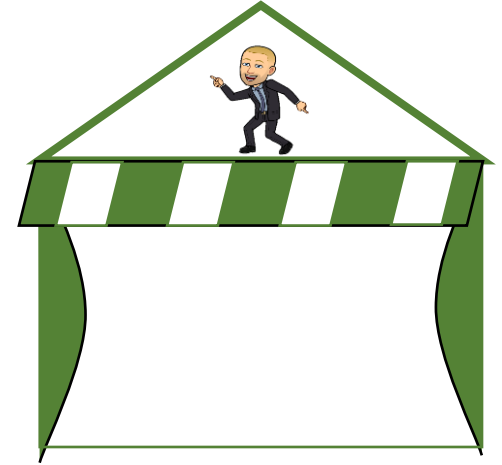


# La Feria



Throughout the Spring and Summer most towns and cities in Andalucía, an autonomous community in the south of Spain, has their own 'Feria'.

'Las Ferias' are very special dates in the calendars of the people of each town and city in Andalucía and are an opportunity to celebrate their people and traditions.

Each 'Feria' has their own individual traditions and differences but there are important commonalities.

The first is the structure of the day. There is the 'day fair', 'la feria del día' and the 'evening fair', 'la feria de noche'.

## La feria del día

The '**Feria del día**' usually showcases traditional activities and involves the enjoyment of lots of delicious local food and drink.

## La Feria de noche

During the evening and night time the festivities change focus to activities including fairground rides and the famous '**casetas**', which are tents that are set up by a variety of associations, businesses and political groups. The '**casetas**' provide live entertainment, dancing as well as local food and drink.

Aside from the structure of the day another common element of the 'feria' is the traditional clothes people wear.

Traditionally women wear a typical dress which called 'flamenca' and men wear an iconic suit.

In addition, a typical sight at the 'ferias' is the dance 'sevillanas'. Furthermore, the kind of music you might hear at the 'feria', ranging from the traditional to the more modern, is often very similar in different 'ferias'.
